



NFL Playoffs: news and notes

This 2023-24 NFL season has been an extraordinary season of football, because of all the storylines and parity in the NFL and the playoffs will definitely be even more intriguing to watch. In these playoffs, 14 teams clinched a playoff spot, seven from the AFC and seven from the NFC. Only the top seeded team from each conference, (the Ravens with the number one overall seed and then the 49ers), are awarded a pivotal bye week, because of the rule changes that were implemented last season; when in past seasons there used to be the top two seeds from each conference awarded a bye week. The other 12 teams that clinched a playoff spot are: Cowboys, Lions, Bills, Chiefs, Browns, Eagles, Dolphins, Texans, Rams, Steelers, Buccaneers, and lastly the Packers.

The NFL Playoffs officially begins with Wildcard Weekend, on Saturday with two AFC playoff games. The 1 st game that day is the Browns vs Texans, at 4:30 p.m. on NBC, which is kind of ironic because if Deshaun Watson was healthy he would've been essentially playing against his former team that traded him. Head Coach DeMeco Ryans and Rookie QB C.J. Stroud were pivotal in leading the Texans to a playoff berth, with their important leadership qualities on and off the field, for the 1 st time in a few years. Kevin Stefanski, Defensive Player of the Year candidate Myles Garret, and old reliable Joe Flacco helped navigate the Browns through an injury riddled season, with their instrumental leadership and their on the field abilities. The Browns ended the year 4-0 when Flacco played, also the Texans defeated the Colts 23-19 to make the playoffs, led by Stroud and Nico Collins.

The 2 nd game that day is Dolphins vs Chiefs, at 8:00 p.m. on Peacock, which is the 2 nd time Tyreek Hill will play against his former team that traded him, but his 1 st time returning to ArrowHead. Both teams finished 11-6 and both teams have contrasting styles, with the Chiefs top five defense vs the Dolphins top five offense. Tua Tagovailoa and Hill were essentially the best QB to WR duo, by both finishing 1 st in passing and receiving yards respectively (4,624 passing yards and 1,799 receiving yards). The Chiefs season was blemished by having a disjointed offense to say the least, also by their receivers leading the league in drops and being extremely undisciplined as most analysts would agree with. Going into the last few games of the season, the Dolphins sustained injuries to many key players like Raheem Mosert, Jaylen Waddle, and etc; especially in the close 21-14 loss to the Bills, while the Chiefs rested their key players vs the Chargers.

NFL Wildcard Weekend

continues on Sunday with three intriguing games which consists of: Steelers vs Bills at 1:00 p.m. on CBS, Packers vs Cowboys at 4:30 p.m. on FOX, and Rams vs Lions at 8:00 p.m. on NBC. The Steelers defeated the number one overall seed in the Ravens, who were resting all key players; 17-10, to make the playoffs for the 1 st time in a few years, even though they had a tumultuous season. The Bills won 5 consecutive games, to make the playoffs and win the division; even though they definitely didn't play all too well, especially with all the team distractions in the beginning of the season. The Packers defeated the Bears 17-9, led by Jordan Love, Aaron Jones, and Jayden Reed, to finally make the playoffs after missing the playoffs last season, with a loss to the Lions.

The Cowboys ended the season 12-5, with Dak Prescott having his best statistical season, but I don't judge the Cowboys in the regular season, but in the playoffs like the 76ers in the NBA, because they always seem to fold and come up short in the playoffs. The Rams had a resurgent season by finishing 10-7, with their young star rookies in Puka Nacua and Kyren Williams leading the resurgence.

The Lions finally made the playoffs and won their division, for the 1 st time in many years, with their young rookie playmakers like Sam LaPorta and Jahmyr Gibbs dominating. The Ram vs Lions game is extremely intriguing, because Matthew Stafford and Jared Goff were traded for each other a couple of years ago and this will definitely be an emotional homecoming for Stafford and his wonderful family.

The final game of Wildcard Weekend is the Eagles vs Buccaneers, at 8:15 on ABC and ESPN. The Eagles finished 11-6, and sadly ended the season 1-5. To make matters worse, some of their key players sustained injuries like Jalen Hurts, A.J. Brown, and DeVonta Smith. The Buccaneers defeated the Panthers 9-0, to reach the playoffs, with Mike Evan having another 1,000 plus receiving yards, and especially Baker Mayfield leading with his leadership on and off the field. NBA 2023-24 season: news and notes

There have definitely been

many intriguing games, players, teams, and storylines this 2023-24 NBA season. Some of those storylines and things above include: the young rising teams, the young rising stars, the In Season Tournament success, the MVP race, the current All-Star team voting, NBA parity, the Rookie of the Year race, and etc. All these things that I have highlighted above, has assuredly led to this extremely entertaining NBA season. Also, there are the championship and playoff contenders who are underperforming to a certain degree and those who are meeting expectations, even with their current situation influx. The top five current

young rising teams are: the Timberwolves (25-10), the Thunder (24-11), the Magic (21-15), the Pacers (21-15), the Kings (21-14). All these teams have exceeded most if not all expectations, have been playing great basketball since the beginning of the season and are way over a .500 or better season record. The main theme that all of these young rising teams have in common is that they each have a young rising star or superstar, combined with a great young core of solid players that are growing with each other. So, the top 10 rising stars and superstars are: Luka Doncic, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, Jayson Tatum, Tyrese Haliburton, Anthony Edwards, De'Aaron Fox, Trae Young, Paola Banchero, Tyler Herro, Tyrese Maxey, and etc. All these young stars and

superstars are averaging over 22 points per game, and all of them except Maxey because of Joel Embiid, are leading their respective teams in scoring. Only Two of them, in Haliburton and Young, are both averaging double-doubles like last season. Haliburton is averaging 23.6 points with 12.5 assists, which evidently leads the NBA and Young is averaging 27.8 points with 11 assists per game. All of these young stars and superstars are primed to make an All-Star team again, or even make their 1 st All-Star team. I honestly believe most if not all these young stars and superstars, will make the All-Star team. They all have made this NBA season even much better, because of the many different spectacular games, plays, and moments that they provide on a daily game basis. Speaking of young and rising stars and superstars, Victor Wembanyama and Chet Holmgren even as rookie are definitely future superstars of the NBA. They both are having monumental impacts or their respective teams, in the Spurs and Thunder, especially defensively cause they both are already top five in blocks, with Wemby leading the NBA with 3.3 blocks, and Holmgren averaging 2.6 blocks per game. was through the roof in every game, the special courts and jerseys were spectacular, and the fans definitely enjoyed it for the most part. The Lakers are currently 4-10 since that game; the 10 th seed in the Western Conference, with an 18-19 record. They recently just defeated the Clippers on Sunday 106-103, but I still think their complimentary basketball problems are still looming, even though Anthony Star team, and they recently defeated the Suns Big Three Monday night 138-111.

The top five MVP candidates are: Embiid (34.6), Doncic (33.7), Nikola Jokic (25.5), SGA (31.5), and Giannis Antetokounmpo (31.4). Four out of the five players are 30 points per game, except Jokic who is close again to averaging a triple-double line last season. Also, three out of the five are averaging double-doubles, except Doncic and SGA. This MVP will definitely go down to the wire, like last season when Embiid won.

Speaking of the Clippers, after their slow start since the James Harden trade, they have definitely been a top five team in the NBA, with Kawhi Leonard, Paul George, Harden all playing complimentary basketball. Russell Westbrook's sacrifice to being a sixth man off the bench, also played a role in their success, especially with HC Tyron Lue leading them. Leonard's and PG's relatively healthy and consistent season has the Clippers as a top five defense with a top 10 offense, which has them 4 th in the Western Conference with a 23-13 record. Since the Big Three in Harden, Leonard, and PG are having great seasons, all three will most likely make and Allimportant NBA news this week. WOJ reported that Haliburton suffered a Grade 1 hamstring strain and will be re-evaluated in two weeks. WOJ also reported that Ja Morant, who returned from a 25-game suspension and played great, sadly suffered a torn labrum, and has to have season ending surgery. WOJ just reported a Breaking News tonight that HC Erik Spoelstra, just signed an eight year \$120 million dollar because he's been the best coach in the NBA the past few years, and the Heat are 4 th in the Eastern Conference with a 21-15 record.

Recognizing these obstacles and developing effective time management strategies to overcome procrastination is essential.


